### Session 1: Cataloging Continuing Resources

This instruction session provides basic cataloging instruction for the RDA instructions relevant to continuing resources, including serials and integrating resources such as online databases. All examples are provided using the MARC 21 Format for Bibliographic Data (MFBD). Participants will be able to apply the RDA instructions specific to continuing resources, identify and distinguish serials and integrating resources, and understand major and minor title changes. Participants will also be introduced to the concept of aggregates.

### Session 2: Cataloging Moving Image Resources

This instruction session provides basic cataloging instruction for the RDA instructions relevant to moving image resources, including streaming and downloadable video files. All examples are provided using the MARC 21 Format for Bibliographic Data (MFBD). Participants will be able to apply the RDA instructions specific to moving images, including electronic audio forms and Playaway Views.

Both sessions will incorporate details specific to electronic resources covered in the January webinar and will include hands-on practice.

### Morning Session: Drone and Drone Headset

Drones have become a hot topic over the last few years, from being used for photography of buildings, animals, and events – to being used for humanitarian efforts such as scanning areas for fire damage, storm damage, and helping locate people. This hands-on session explores the usage of drones; recreational and professional use, as well as laws and regulations. We will even get to fly the drones.

We will cover the basics of drone safety and use; with a focus on how we might use drones in our library... today and into the future. If you have a drone or want to start a drone program, this is a great workshop for you. If you are unsure of the uses of a drone and want to get your feet wet, this introduction to drones will cover all the bases. We will also be using a headset to “virtually” see what the drone sees – you will be able to move the camera with your head and see the world from the sky.

### Afternoon Session: Coding with Robotics

Coding and robotics have been evolving at an alarming rate; people of all ages have the accessibility to build and code robotics, regardless of age and skill level. This hands-on workshop explores coding with a variety of different robotics; from products that don't require a computer to code, to robots that can be coded through drawing, to robotics that need to be built and programmed. We will cover the basics of Scratch as many of the robots we will play with can be programmed with it. We will also explore the basics of using Arduino based languages.

Even if you have never programmed before, you will be coding your first moving interactive robot by the end of the workshop. If you are more experienced in coding robotics, this workshop will highlight a variety of products you can incorporate into your Makerspace and programs that you can run in your library.

# Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) - Basics



Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) is one of the most widely-used controlled vocabularies in the world. Librarians in general (not just catalogers!) should have a solid understanding of how LCSH headings and subheadings are constructed and used to better serve users performing subject searches.



This workshop will provide a brief history of LCSH, the principles behind its construction, guidance on how to locate LCSH on the web, and the application of LCSH to library resources. Participants will gain a deeper understanding of LCSH and, therefore, utilize them more effectively to serve their users.
