Beginners Guide to Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records (FRBR)

Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records (FRBR) is currently the underlying conceptual model for the Resource Description & Access (RDA) cataloging standard. Although The International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) has merged its conceptual models into the new Library Reference Model (LRM), there are many aspects of FRBR that remain and need to be understood in order to effectively use RDA.

In this webinar covering the basics of library cataloging, FRBR terminology will be explained, practical examples provided, and the fundamentals of the IFLA LRM explored. Once these webinars are completed, a face-to-face workshop will be held to reinforce and build upon the foundation provided in these webinars.
