



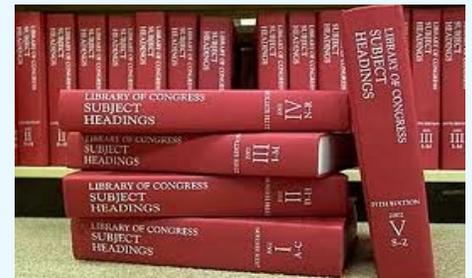
## [Introduction to Library of Congress Subject Headings \(LCSH\)](#)

Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) is one of the most widely-used controlled vocabularies in the world. Librarians (not just catalogers!) should have a solid understanding of how LCSH is structured and assigned in order to perform more efficient subject searches.



This webinar (the first of two) will provide a brief history of LCSH and an explanation of why controlled vocabularies are important (and controversial). The instructor will provide guidance on how to locate LCSH on the web and discuss the application of LCSH to library resources. Participants will gain a deeper understanding of LCSH and, therefore, utilize them more effectively to serve their users.

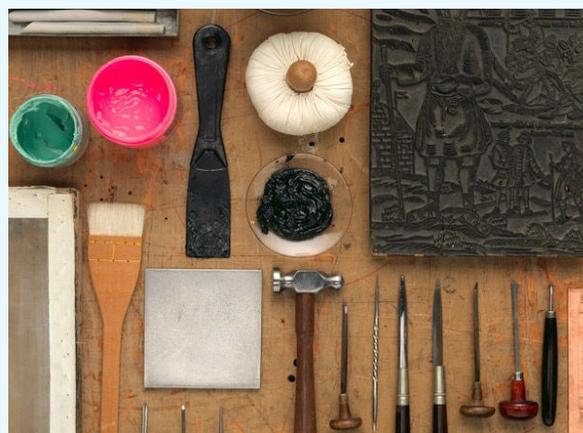

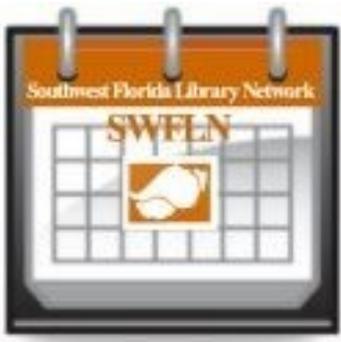

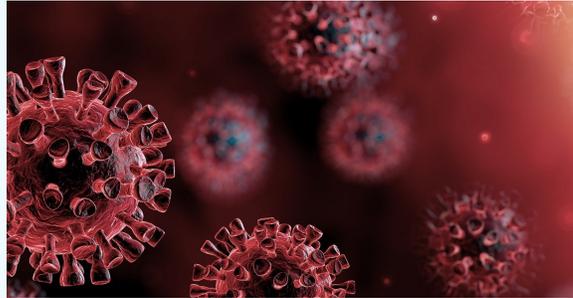


## COVID! Where Are We Now in 2021?
